Description of the artwork

Interactive trees generating lights and sounds

Phonofolium Tetraedre is an interactive artwork with 3 living trees reacting to the human touch by sounds and lights. Several sound and light characters are revealed when the audience is touching or stroking lightly them. The intensity of light's variations evolves according to the intensity of the human contact with the trees.

The interactions of people with the trees illuminate and highlight a tetraedre light structure in front of the trees. Each face of the structure is connected to a tree. The intensity and color of the light of each face evolves according to the interaction with the tree.

Phonofolium lets us know about their existence by a scream, a melody and a lighting vibration. Sound characters and lights generate various feelings and influence feedbacks of audience.

The scenography of this artwork will enhance the environment that surround it through several scenarios of sounds and light's tints.

The diversity of these scenarios and the unpredictable interactivity of visitors will generate a dynamic, warm, and poetic environment. Through interactions with the tree, this installation invites audience to think about our contemporary relationships with our natural environment. It creates a space time of poetic relations and exchanges between people, beyond a basic connection.

In their artwork, the artists Scenocosme create hybrids between plants and digital technology. They use plants like natural sensors sensitive to the electrostatic energy of the human body. In this kind of artworks, the technology disappears in order to enhance sensory relations and to augment senses. The spectators share extraordinary sensory experiences. The interactive plants artworks of these artists are shown all over the world.

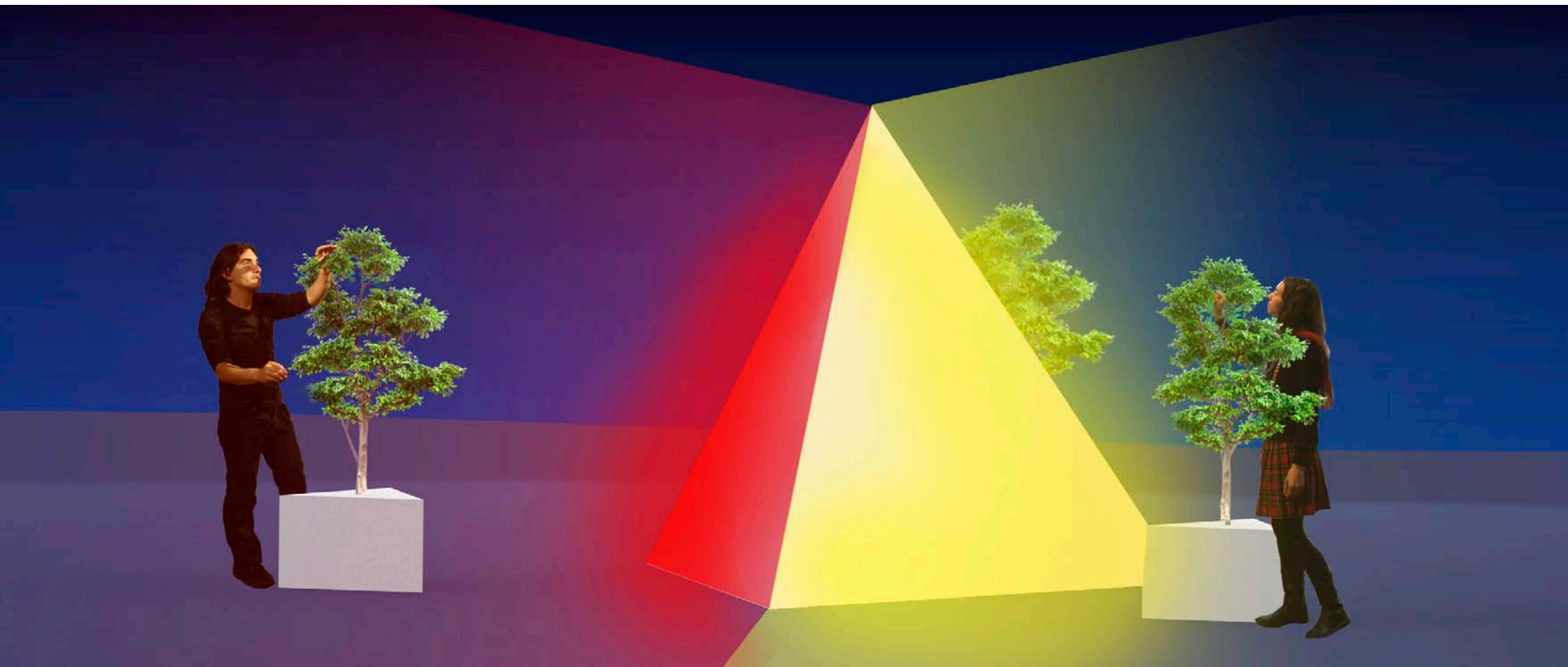
Synchronisation between sound and colours of light

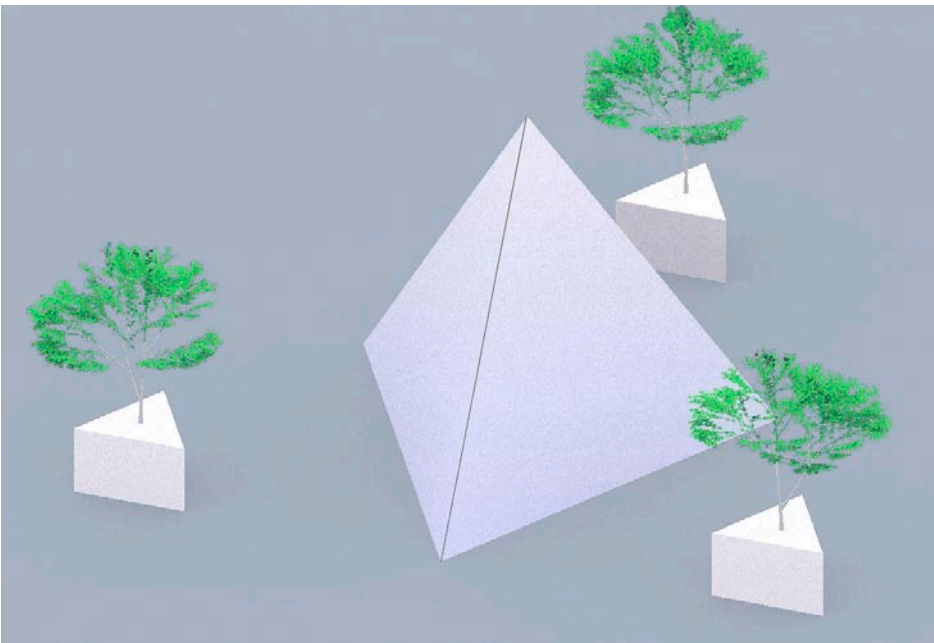
Sonorous and colourful light textures evolve according to the approach, the touch and the intensity of electrostatic energy emits from the human bodies. Scenocosme study how sounds and lights can influence relations between visitors and plants. They explore its power of retro-action, and how it can stimulate feelings and touch.

There is a fine correlation between intensity of contacts and intensity of musicality as light. Thus, variations of proximity and electrostatic energy influence sonorous and light textures: If one person touches totally the plant, it generates sonorities with high pitch. If more persons touch the plant energies are added and sonorities are more high. If one person touches lightly the plant or approaches at few centimetres without touch, sonorities are more low.

Several group of sounds are associated to various light tints in order to propose lots of possibilities. The pitch of the sound varies according to the energetic intensity of the relation. The light tint associated to the sound evolves according to the pitch. It offers a vibrating and fragile light links to small energetic variations between bodies.(for example : a warm sound is associated to a red tint)

When nobody interacts, a soft white light is diffused like a breathe from the tetraedre.





Scenography/ Technical informations

The artwork produces lights and sounds
It should be show in a dark area.
Sounds and lights systems are integrated inside.
The sounds comes from each pedestal of the plants.

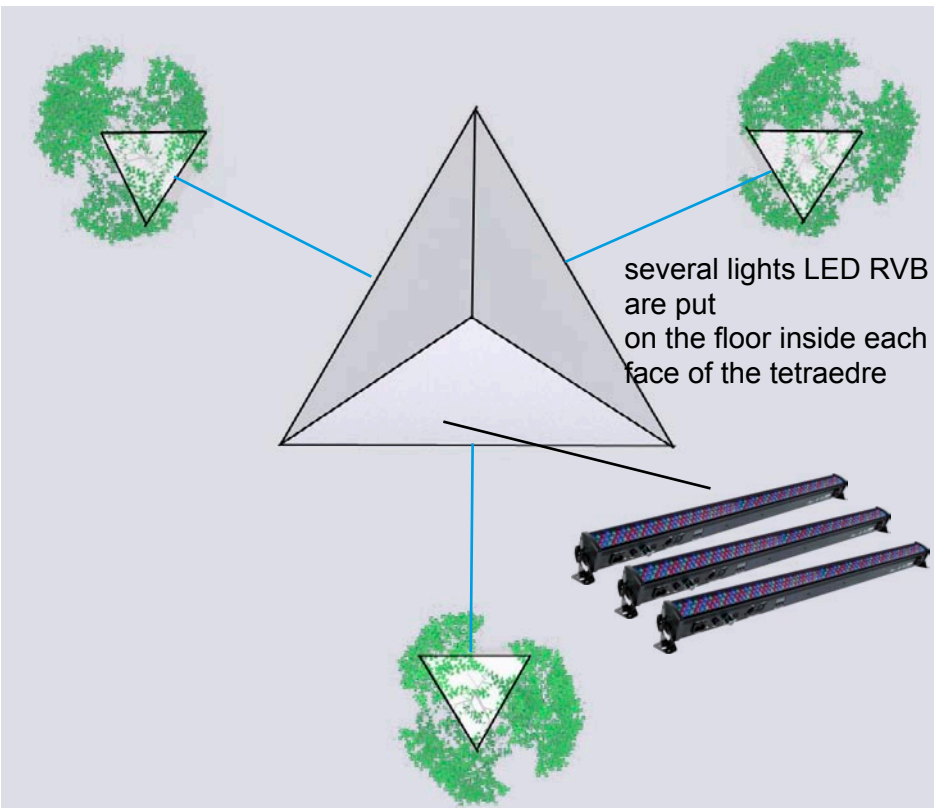

Artistic process : hybridizations between nature and digital technology

As media artists, Scenocosme: Grégory Lasserre & Anaïs met den Ancxt, explore capacities of technologies in order to draw sensitive relationships through specific stagings where senses are augmented. Their works came from possible hybridizations between the living world and technology which meeting points incite them to invent sensitive and poetic languages.

They suggest to sound out, to feel elements of reality which are invisible or to whom we are insensitive. They use the idea of the cloud as a metaphor of the invisible. Because it has an unpredictable form, it is in indeterminate metamorphosis, and his process escapes to our perception. Various natural and artificial clouds surround us (climatic, biological, energetic or electromagnetic). Through their artworks, they evoke invisible energetic clouds (electrostatic) which follow living beings like unpredictable shadows. Sometimes, these clouds cross together and exchange some information. In a poetic way, they interpret these invisible links through sonorous and visual stagings. Then, when they imagine the energetic clouds of living beings, the limits of the body become permeable, and with their technology, in a way they design extraordinary relationships, between humans, and between humans and environment too. Interactions they offer in their works make invisible exchanges sensitive. Rather than revealing clearly their complexity, they open everyone's imagination. Between the reality and our perception, there is always a «blind point» which stimulates the imagination.

When they create interactive works, Scenocosme invent sonorous or/and visual languages. They translate the exchanges between living beings and between the body and its environment. They suggest interrelations where invisible becomes perceptible. Materialized, our sensations are augmented. Through a poetic interpretation of invisible mechanisms, technologies allow them to draw sensory relationships, and to generate unpredictable living interactions. Their hybrid artworks play with their own augmented senses. They live with technology and have reactions which escape deliberately to their control.

The couple artists Gregory Lasserre and Anaïs met den Ancxt work under the name Scenocosme. They live in the Rhone-Alpes region in France. Their singular artworks use diverse expressions: interactive installations, visual art, digital art, sound art, collective performances etc.... Scenocosme mix art and digital technology to find substances of dreams, poetry, sensitivity and delicacy. These artists overturn various technologies in order to create contemporary artworks. Their works came from possible hybridizations between the technology and living world (plants, stones, water, wood, humans,...) which meeting points incite them to invent sensitive and poetic languages. The most of their interactive artworks feel several various relationships between the body and the environment. They can feel energetic variations of living beings and design interactive stagings in which spectators share extraordinary sensory experiences. Their artworks are exhibited in numerous museums, contemporary art centres and digital art festivals in the world.

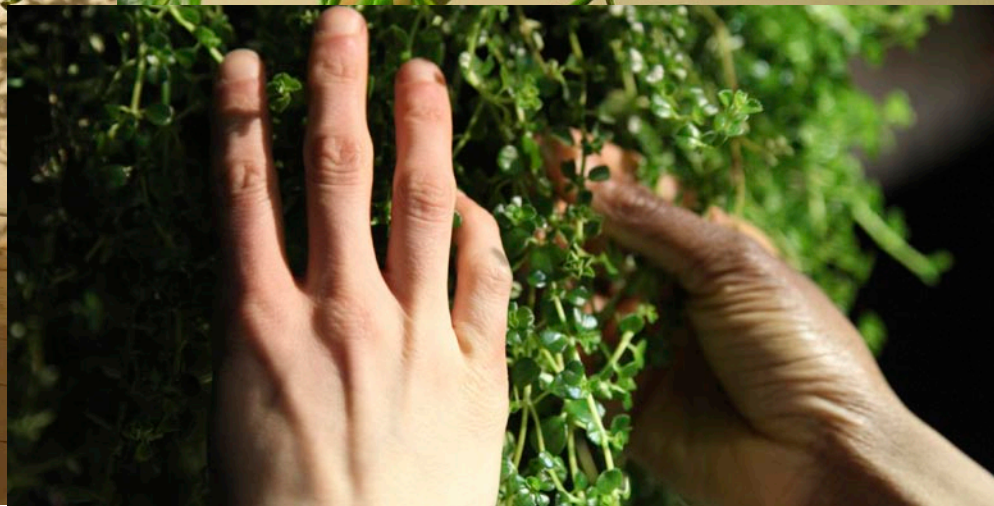
